6. Native American canoes were made of several different materials. From what material is the Nez Perce canoe made? Do you know the name of this type of canoe?
7. Locate the photographic evidence that there was an area known as "Lewiston Heights". What is the Resource Identifier number? Do you recognize the location? Note the woman dressed in Victorian style clothing standing on the terrace.
8. In what year was the photo of Wa-nik-noote taken?
